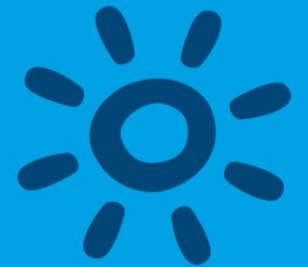

NPSFM 2020 requires ...

- Tighter timeframe
 - notified plan for region by 31 Dec 2024
- Te Mana o te Wai framework
 - principles and hierarchy for managing freshwater:
 - wellbeing of freshwater bodies
 - health needs of people
 - social, cultural and economic wellbeing
- Strengthened involvement of tangata whenua.
- Compulsory mahinga kai value
- New monitoring, reporting, wetland and stream requirements
- + more

Key shifts for work programme

- Progress all Water Management Areas and review Regional Natural Resources Plan (RNRP) at once.
- One RPS and one RNRP change notified by 2024.
- Stronger collaboration arrangements with iwi.
- Probably intensive community engagement in 2023 some engagement earlier

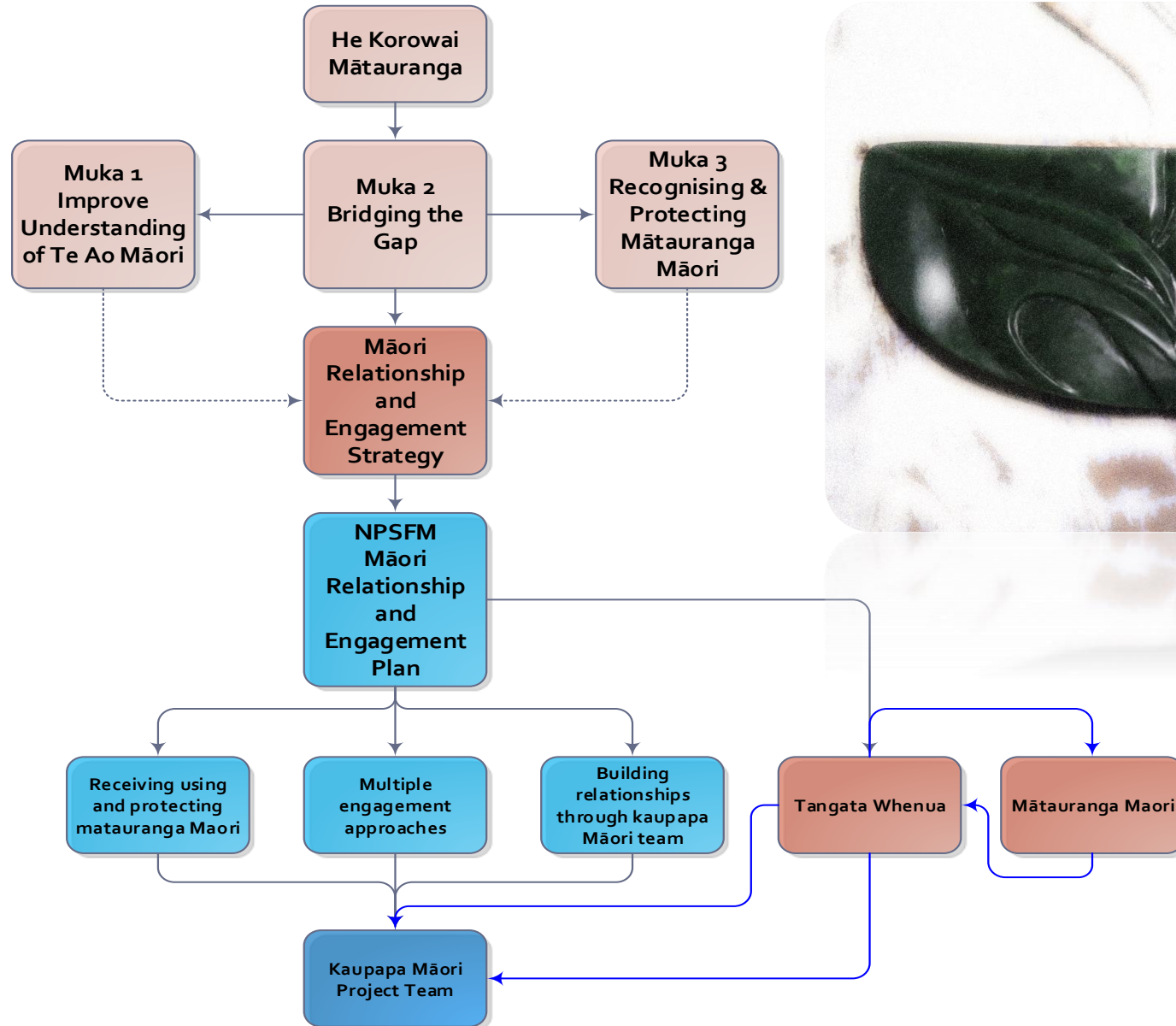

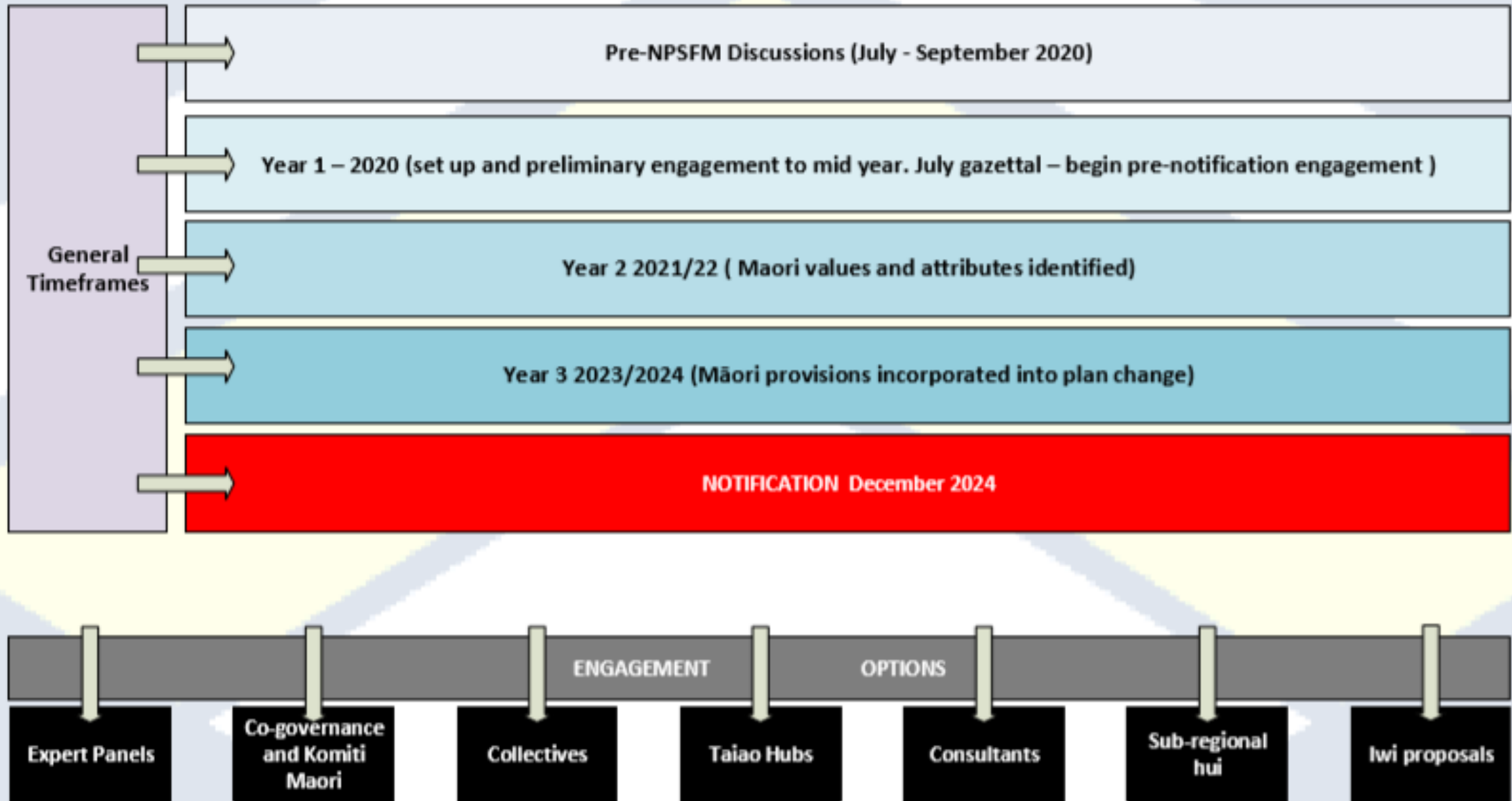

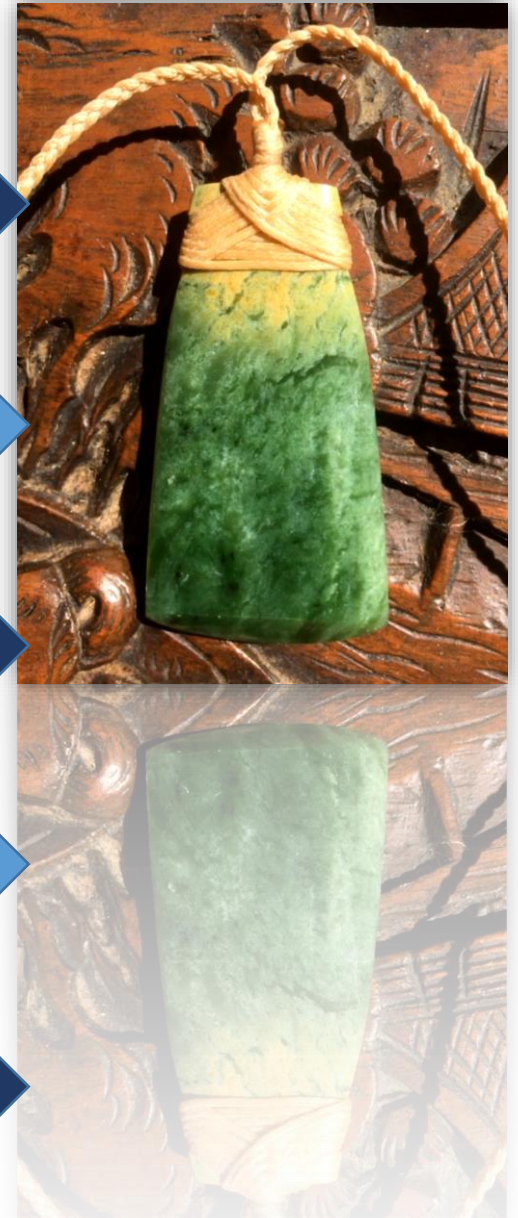
